**Revenue**

- 1 Income – Taxes** – Property Tax Income came in less than expected for May.
- 2 Income – Bond Levy** – We satisfied our bond levy obligation in January. The law requires that all property tax money go to the Bond until that income line has reached 100%.
- 3 Income – Sales Tax & Ag Equip** – Sales Tax Income is received quarterly. This line is under budget for three quarters and may end the year under budget.
- 4 Income – Coop Electric Agreement** – This annual payment arrives in July.
- 5 Income – Personal Property Replacement** – The first semi-annual payment arrived in January and is above expectations.
- 6 Income – Property Tax Relief** – The first semi-annual payment arrived in January and is below expectations.
- 7 Income – State Add'l Tax Relief** – This is a new income line as a result of new legislation from House Bill #292. After further clarification from the county auditor's office, this is replacement property tax income paid by the State. This income will be received in semi-annual installments.
- 8 Income – ST Homeowners Tax Relief** – This is a new income line as a result of new legislation from House Bill #292. After further clarification from the county auditor's office, this is replacement property tax income paid by the State. This income will be received in semi-annual installments.
- 9 Income – URD Close** – URD funds may continue to trickle in throughout the year.
- 10 Income – Copiers/Printers** – Copier/Printer income is below budget for May.
- 11 Income – Donations** – Donation income this month comes from a variety of library members in support of purchasing replacement materials lost at Athol and Post Falls.
- 12 Income – Fees** – Fee income is below budget for May.
- 13 Income – Lost & Paid** – Lost and paid income is below budget for May.
- 14 Income – Grants** – Grant income received this month will support Summer STEM activities.
- 15 Income – CLN Friends Grants** – Grant income received this month with support the Harrison Family Festival.
- 16 Income – Post Falls Friends Grants** – No income this month.
- 17 Income – Interest** – Interest income is above budget for the year.

## Expenditures

**19-25 Salary Components** – The Salary Components, in total through May are at 61.64% of their budgeted amount.

**26 Adult Programs** – Adult programming is below budget for the month. This line varies quite a bit as programs are planned and presented.

**27 Children's Programs** – Children's programming expense is below budget for the month. This line varies quite a bit as programs are planned and presented. Summer Reading is underway.

**28 Collections** – Collections spending is below budget for the month.

**29 Communications/Marketing** – Expenditures this month are for printing the Summer Reading guide and related collateral materials. This line will increase as programs require marketing materials.

**30 Emerging Tech. Programs** – No expenditures this month.

**31 OCLC/Databases** – No expenditures this month.

**32 Software** – The expense this month includes the monthly hosting services for Office 365 and the renewal for self-check service.

**33 Internet Access** – Fatbeam is our vendor that brings the internet into our central hub at Post Falls. E-rate discounts are being applied.

**34 Telecom** – Fatbeam connects all our facilities to the central hub for internet access. T-Mobile is our hot spot provider. Verizon provides wireless access for Chromebooks, the bookmobile and several devices used by facilities staff. E-rate discounts are being applied.

**35 Tech Proc/Office** – Tech processing and supplies is at budget for May. The negative amount reflects reimbursement from ICRMP for boxes needed to store materials from Athol and Post Falls.

**36 Grants** – Expenses this month purchased supplies and equipment for Summer STEM activities.

**37 Grants – CLN Friends** – Expenses this month purchased books and supplies for Summer Reading.

**38 Grants – Post Falls Friends** – Expenses this month purchased books and supplies for Summer Reading.

**40 Janitorial** – Janitorial expenses this month include regular monthly cleaning at all locations. We are receiving a reduced rate since Athol and Post Falls are not fully open.

**41 Library Equip (under \$2500)** – Purchases this month include networking equipment for the temporary office location, a new electrified couch for Pinehurst, and a new exterior bulletin board for Harrison.

**42 Mileage & Vehicle Maint.** – Expenses this month include fuel for District vehicles and mileage reimbursement for some staff members.

**43 Outreach Vehicles** – Expenses this month include fuel for the outreach vehicles.

**44-50 Repairs & Maint. (as a group)** – As a group, repairs and maintenance are at -21.22% for May. The negative amount reflects receiving insurance claim funds for removing materials at Athol. Other expenses this month are landscape maintenance at all locations, pest control at two locations, HVAC repairs at Pinehurst, and moving expenses to the temporary office location.

**51 Snow Removal** – This line is complete for the year.

**52 Telephones** – Telephone expenses are on target for May.

**53-59 Utilities (as a group)** – As a group, utilities are at 60.94% for May. This month includes regular expenses for electricity, gas, water, sewer, and garbage.

**61 Audit** – The audit is complete and has been presented. CIN will reimburse the District for their portion of the audit expense once the last bill is received.

**62 Bank Svc Chg.** – Bank service charge expense is below budget for the month.

**63 Bond Principal Payment** – Our bond principal is paid in July.

**64 Bond Interest** – Our bond Interest is paid semi-annually in January and July.

**65 CIN** – We pay our dues to CIN quarterly. The next quarterly payment will be in July.

**66 Courier** – We pay our courier payments to CIN quarterly. The next quarterly payment will be in July.

**67 Copiers** – Copier expenses are paid quarterly and are just above budget for two quarters.

**68 Dues** – No expense this month.

**69 Insurance** – The second half of the ICRMP policy has now been paid. 100% of the Great American Insurance policy was paid in October. This line ends the year above budget.

**70A & 70B Legal & Professional** – The lines, collectively, are below budget for May, however, the invoice for May legal services has not been received yet. Legal expenses are above budget for the month and Professional Services are below budget for the month. Professional Services expenses this month include fees for the electronic time-keeping payroll system, collection services for past due patron accounts, and COBRA administration.

**71 Petty Cash Expense** – Minimal expense this month.

**72 Postage** – Postage is below budget for May.

**73 Sales Tax Expense** – This is paid quarterly based on the amount of income we receive from copier and printer use. We will make the next quarterly payment in June.

**74 Storage Rental** – Storage rental is below budget for May.

**75 Training/Conf. Travel** – The negative amount reflects ICFL reimbursing the District for expenses related to the Directors Summit.

## BALANCE SHEET

**Current Assets** – Includes month end checking account balances as well as Property Tax Receivable. Property Tax Receivable is examined and adjusted annually by the auditor.

### **Property and Equipment**

All capital property and equipment balances reflect the current value of the assets. These are examined and adjusted annually by the auditor.

**Land** – No change this month.

**Land improvements** – No change this month.

**Buildings** – The final invoices for the lighting project at Hayden have been received and paid. The reduced balance reflects receiving the first Avista rebate for the lighting project and receiving funds from ICRMP to cover repairs at Athol and Post Falls.

**Vehicles** – No change this month.

**Equipment & Furniture** – No change this month.

**Collections** – No change this month.

### **Other Assets**

**Mtn West MMK – Henderson Fund** – This account is a fund dedicated to Youth Services purchases in the District.

**ICS** – This stands for “Insured Cash Sweep” and is the account where we receive the most stable interest on funds we anticipate holding for longer periods of time. The ICS account holds the majority of our cash on hand and keeps our funds within the guidelines of FDIC insurance.

**CARRF** – Our Capital Asset Repair and Replacement available funds appear here. This account is currently over the FDIC insurance limits and staff will be looking for more secure options while maintaining liquidity for upcoming capital projects.

**CARRF-CDARS** – CARRF funds in excess of FDIC insurance limits are held in this group of short-term CDs.

**Mtn West MMK – Pinehurst Bequest** – This account is a fund dedicated to the Pinehurst library.

**Amount to provide for long-term debt** – These assets would be used in the event we needed to pay someone their accrued vacation time if they left the District. (See “Accrued Annual Leave” below.)

### **Current Liabilities**

All current liabilities are examined and adjusted annually by the auditor.

**Accts Payable** – Invoices for May arrived late and will be paid in June.

**Accrued Payroll Liabilities** – a portion of the October payroll included some days in September of the prior fiscal year.

**SUTA Payable** – Unemployment taxes accrue monthly and are paid quarterly.

**Accrued Annual Leave** – This is close to the same amount (\$0.16 difference is due to rounding during the audit process) listed as an asset above and represents our current liability to pay those with accrued vacation time.

**Bond Interest Payable** – This amount is established annually at the close of the fiscal year through audit adjustments.

### **Long-Term Liabilities**

**Bonds Payable** – This is the amount currently owed on our bond.

**Premium on Bonds Payable** – This amount is established annually at the close of the fiscal year through audit adjustments.

**Deferred Property Tax Revenue** – This is the portion not paid within 60 days of the end of our fiscal year. The amount is established annually at the close of the fiscal year through audit adjustments.

### **Net Assets**

**Net Invest in Fixed Assets** – This is the value of all the District's fixed assets minus our bond debt. The amount is established annually at the close of the fiscal year through audit adjustments.

**Net Assets – Unrestricted** – These are liquid assets. The amount is established annually at the close of the fiscal year through audit adjustments.

**Restricted Net Assets** – This reflects end-of-year entries through audit adjustments and includes assets for the following restricted funds: Smithsonian and all other unexpended grant monies and dedicated donations.

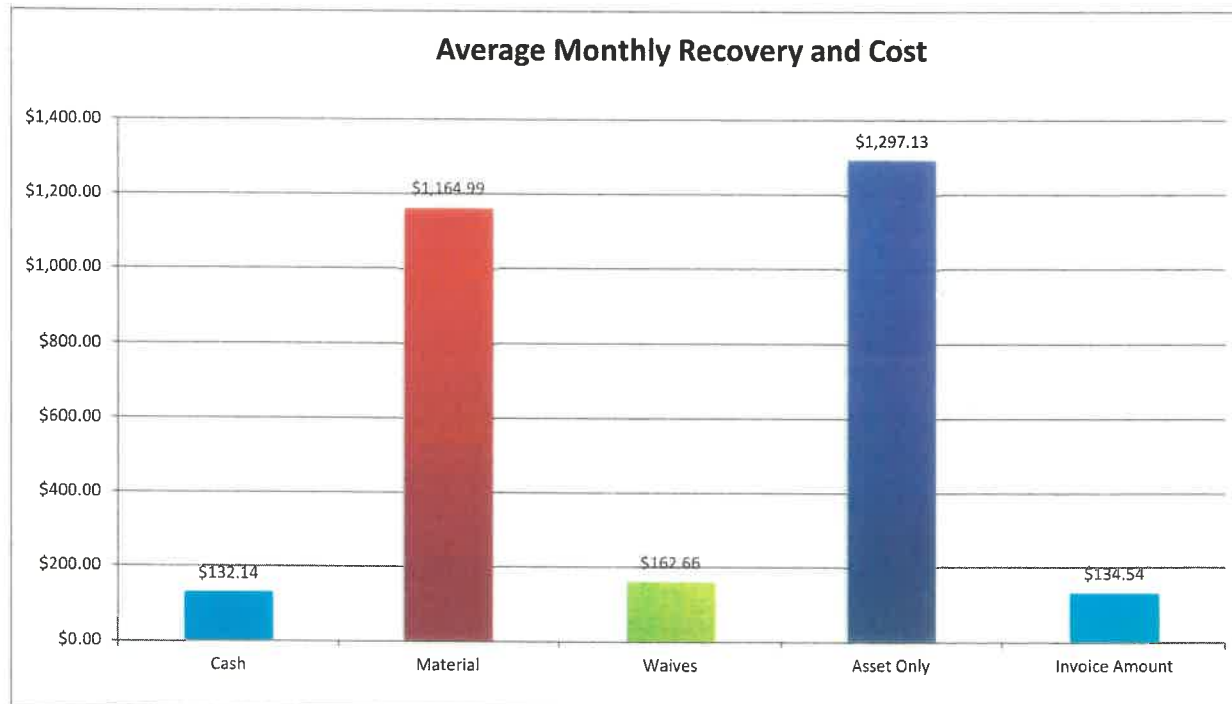

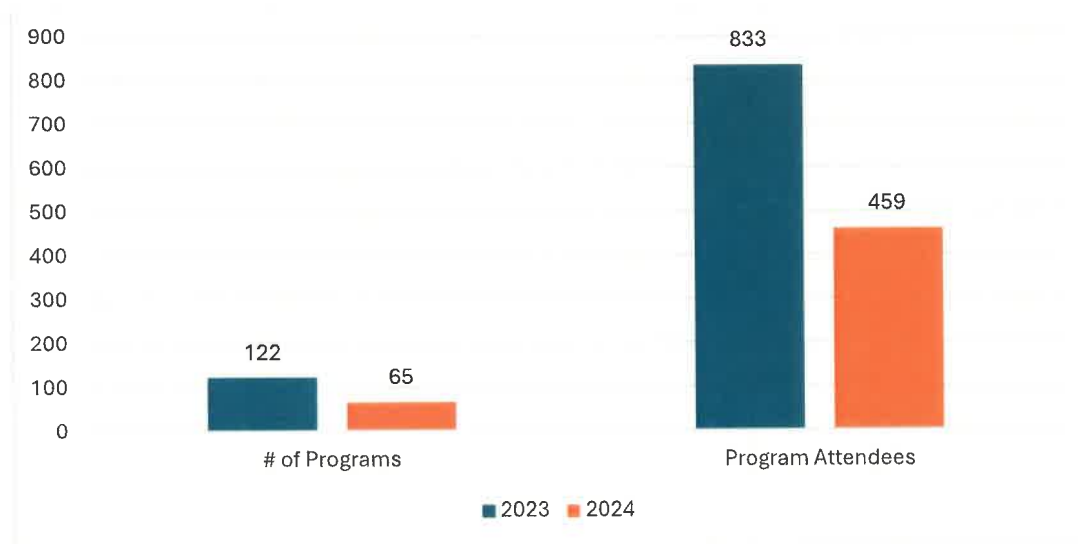

In May we saw the return of staff, limited services, and community to the Athol and Post Falls libraries. Athol library, working through the bookmobile, still does not have dedicated space for programs, but is keeping members engaged with passive programs and take-home kits. Post Falls, which has half a meeting room, has restarted some of its smaller, regular meeting groups, like the yarn and book clubs. In combination with Youth Services, both libraries also held Welcome Back/Summer Preview events which drew large crowds. The librarians at both agree that it has been really nice to see their communities coming together again.

In addition to all their regular programming, all the libraries celebrated Health Literacy this month with a special program focusing on brain health and mindfulness. Part of our strategic plan is to expand intergenerational programming, so this program centered on bringing two fairly disparate age groups together, teens and seniors, by focusing on something important to both—keeping the brain healthy and focused. We brought in an expert speaker from the Alzheimer’s Association to talk about tips for keeping the brain healthy and we followed up with hands-on activities learning about both essential oils and virtual reality and how we might use them for brain health and mindfulness. The program was more popular at some libraries than others but was a great opportunity to introduce members to some of the great resources we offer (and our community offers) for long-term health.

Our Overdrive/Libby service continues to be very popular with our members. In the first five months of this year, we circulated 67,691 items compared to 53,025 items in the same period last year for a 27% increase in circulation so far in 2024.

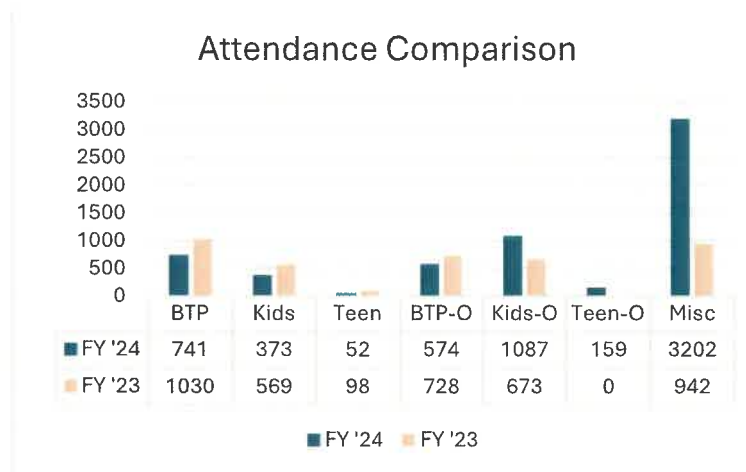

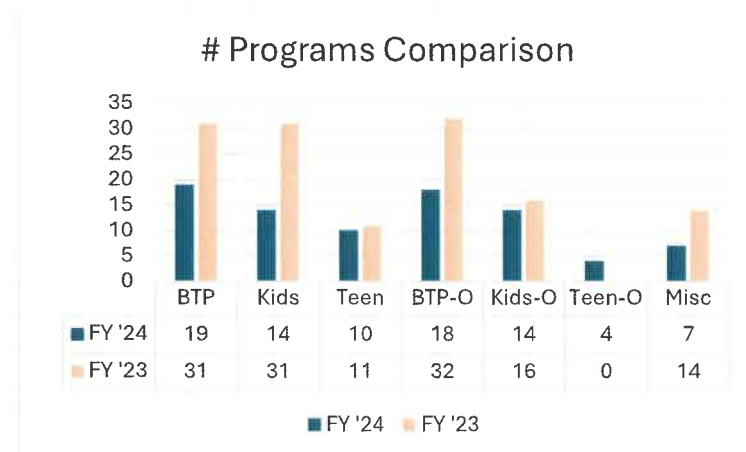
## Youth Services

May 2024

This month we served 6,188 children, teens, and caregivers at programs. This is a 53% increase from May 2023, which saw 4,040 in attendance.



We held 86 programs this month, compared to 135 programs in May 2023; a decrease of 36%.

**Public-Facing:** Harrison hosted Weird Little Breakfast Club for teens, where they made chocolate chip waffles and talked about books. Regular programs will move to Saturday for the summer.

In Spirit Lake, the Afterschool Adventures kids loved the shaving cream science program, which also involved art. They had a lot of fun using shaving cream, sometimes combined with other supplies such as glue or cornstarch, to create puffy paint, marbled paintings, and foam putty. We did the program outside to minimize the mess, and the weather cooperated. The kids didn't want to stop creating, and I was cleaning up around them as they continued to explore.

Rathdrum ended preschool story time on a rather high note as they had the pleasure of giving each family an amazing box filled with art supplies to last throughout the summer. The boxes were provided free of charge by the Idaho Association for the Education of Young Children, with the pledge to keep families active and engaged together. The boxes initially felt a little overwhelming, with so many great items for families, so the Youth Services team brainstormed some ideas on how

the items could be used. Katie drafted a flier outlining ideas for the parents on some easy hands-on activities all related to the alphabet. Families were so appreciative of receiving the boxes as well as getting the flier of ideas. Staff loved connecting with the families and of course this connection was an excellent segway for me to invite them to sign up their children, as well as themselves, for our summer reading program. Athol, Hayden, Post Falls, Rathdrum, and Spirit Lake received boxes, distributing over 400 boxes to families.

May is a time for us to host school tours and offer class visits to talk about summer reading and library cards. Staff enjoy having the opportunity to talk with children of all ages about the library and encourage kids to read over the summer.

**Library staffing:**

The Youth Services team continues to collaborate and provide unwavering support to each other and their community. When staff are sick or need assistance at programs, team members step up without question to assist. Having a dedicated, well-trained, supportive staff ensures high quality experiences for all members to attend programs or visit our libraries.

**Community impact:**

Athol provided outreach to multiple schools this month. The highlight was visiting Athol Elementary to promote summer reading to every class. I read *If Monet Painted a Monster*. Then we did an art project - make a monster. The kids were super creative, and I loved the stories the kids made to go with their monster. One boy created a monster that "only eats librarians." A very sweet girl asked if I was visiting the local childcare this summer as "you're the only thing that makes it bearable." Bethany is happy to report the childcare should be able to come to many of my programs.

Hayden was invited to host a Storytime at New Leaf Nursery. This was the second event partnering with the nursery and was such a success! Between our and New Leaf Nursery's promotion, we drew in a crowd of nearly 160 people. During the program we read stories about gardening, did STEAM activities using cyanotype paper, and distributed giveaway kits from the Idaho Commission for Libraries. It details many of the dirty tactics strategically used to turn Colorado from red to blue. You will then recognize many of the things happening in Idaho that previously didn't make sense.

The year I was elected (2021) to the Community Library Network board, a CDA Press article trashed me saying this was the first time someone elected to a non-partisan race here had put their political affiliation with their name on the ballot. I knew I hadn't done so, but wanted to make sure. I had the elections office send me a sample ballot from that election and sure enough: only

my name was listed, no political affiliation. This "reported fact" was completely made up out of thin air, and I have proof. I communicated this to the CDA Press, but don't remember ever seeing or hearing of a retraction.

# Traditional Republicans battle for control of party

## Kootenai County conservatives mount offensive against extremism

Self-described traditional Republicans are pushing to retake control of the political party in Kootenai County, which they say has grown increasingly extreme and no longer represents conservative values.

Their full-court press strategy is to challenge nearly every one of the 73 Republican precinct committee seats in the May 21 election with a who's-who roster of prominent community members including 29 former elected Republicans.

Their names include Coeur d'Alene Mayor Jim Hammond, former state Sen. Mary Souza, former Sheriff Pierce Clegg and former County Commissioner Todd Tondee.

Precinct committeemen make up the Kootenai County Republican Central Committee, the official local Republican Party.

The North Idaho Republicans is an association and political action committee that was established a couple of years ago to push back against KCRCC's influence on nonpartisan races – in particular, the boards of North Idaho College and the Community Library Network.

“The current committee has gone too far,” said Jack Riggs, a former lieutenant governor and cofounder of the North Idaho Republicans, who said that those in charge of the central committee are mostly libertarians and constitutionalists who go well beyond the traditional conservatism of Abraham Lincoln and Ronald Reagan.

While they have supported candidates for other offices in the past, this election the North Idaho Republicans are focusing solely on the precinct committee races. Precinct committeemen are an often-overlooked partisan office elected every two years to represent individual neighborhoods. Their races regularly go unchallenged.

“We know the importance of the precincts, that is the foundation of the party,” Riggs said.

Control of the party could influence the direction of the general election in November.

“We believe this very deeply: precinct committeemen will be the most important race on the ballot,” said Riggs, who is not running for one of the seats.

The North Idaho Republicans have endorsed 70 candidates. Only two of those are incumbent committeemen: Bob Thornton and Coeur d’Alene City Councilman Dan Gookin.

They would need 37 seats for a majority to elect a new chairman at the reorganization meeting 10 days after the election.

Christa Hazel, a former committeewoman and founding member of North Idaho Republicans, said the idea to go after precincts to take over local parties was advocated by political strategist Steve Bannon a few years ago, and current KCRCC leadership followed that playbook. This campaign is a countereffort.

“I think the KCRCC is a little surprised at the effort by North Idaho Republicans to only focus on precinct races,” said Hazel, who is also the founder of Save NIC, which advocates for North Idaho College amid its accreditation crisis.

A North Idaho Republicans radio ad says the KCRCC has been a breeding ground for extremism that has brought chaos and disgrace to the community.

“Instead of investing in schools and libraries, KCRCC promotes white nationalists and extremists who want to take over our state,” the ad said.

KCRCC Chairman Brent Regan claimed the campaign is a coordinated effort from Boise that is being attempted all over the state.

In his “Common Sense” opinion column published in the Coeur d’Alene Press, Regan said the North Idaho Republicans are allied with the Gem State Conservatives, an organization he says is trying to flip Idaho in a “Gem State Heist.”

The phrase was coined by Gregg Pruett, vice chairman of the Constitution Party of Idaho and creator of the website Keep Idaho Free. Pruett takes the phrase from a 2014 documentary, “Rocky Mountain Heist,” that blames the shift of Colorado from a red state to a blue state on a few wealthy leftists.

Pruett, Regan and others are spreading the conspiracy theory that the same thing is happening in Idaho. Riggs calls that absurd.

The Gem State Conservatives was founded by two former Idaho Republican Party chairs Tom Luna and Trent Clark. The political action committee advocates for “big tent” conservatism across the state.

Riggs said that while he is aware of the Gem State Conservatives, and the two organizations overlap on some of their goals, North Idaho Republicans are acting locally on their own.

They have received no money from the Gem State Conservatives, he added.

Asked about his vision for the future of the KCRCC, Regan said, “It’s in our mission statement.”

KCRCC’s mission, according to its website, “is to enhance freedom and prosperity by promoting fiscally and socially conservative candidates who will implement the Idaho Republican Party Platform as policy.”

The Idaho Republican Party Platform, adopted in July 2022, takes a strong stance on social issues, in addition to responsible fiscal policy, lower taxes and small government.

For example, the platform affirms that “abortion is murder from the moment of fertilization.”

It defines marriage as between one man and one woman, and says Idaho can nullify any federal law or court ruling that requires states to recognize same-sex marriages. The party also is strongly opposed to any “social justice indoctrination” in Idaho’s education system, including social emotional learning, or diversity, equity and inclusion.

Coeur d’Alene resident Dave Patzer is running against Regan for his precinct seat. Patzer says on his campaign website that he seeks “a departure from Regan’s divisiveness” and a return to common sense.

Gookin, a Coeur d’Alene city councilman and one of the few running uncontested, said chairman Brent Regan runs committee meetings “like a dictator” and that he has packed the committee with loyalists through appointments.

“It is no longer a Republican central committee, it is a committee that obeys the chairman,” Gookin said.

The KCRCC is suing Gookin, alleging he defamed the organization by saying the political group has rigged its candidate rating and vetting process and violated campaign finance laws.

Gookin called the lawsuit frivolous retaliation for his legitimate criticisms of the party’s endorsements of nonpartisan races.

“He needs to go, and in order to get him out, we need to get his supporters out,” Gookin said.

Riggs said the KCRCC’s goal is to take control of every elected office in the county, all the way from county-level officials to city council and school board members down to highway and water districts.

The wake-up call came from the havoc they say KCRCC-backed board members have done to North Idaho College that led to sanctions and have put the school at risk of losing accreditation.

NIC Trustees Greg McKenzie and Todd Banducci are both defending their precinct committee seats. Another NIC trustee, Brad Corkill, who is on the college board’s minority faction, withdrew from a precinct committee race against Jamie Hass.

Incumbent committeeman Art Macomber, a former NIC attorney, also dropped out of the race, leaving Mary Souza unopposed for that precinct.

The other concern is the Community Library Network, the county’s library system outside of Coeur d’Alene, whose KCRCC-supported trustees have withdrawn from the American Library Association and are working to overhaul the library’s materials policy to restrict what it considers sexually explicit materials for children.

“I am opposed to pornography for children,” Riggs said, “but their approach is to tear the library system apart.”

A common insinuation against the North Idaho Republicans and their candidates is that they are RINOs – Republicans in name only.

“That’s all they can do,” Riggs said, “they call anybody who doesn’t fall in

line and do what they want a 'RINO.' ”

Beyond that term, Riggs said the name-calling online is much nastier.

Gookin said the label points to a lack of positive vision.

“Rather than be persuasive, they call names,” Gookin said. “I don’t think people are buying it anymore.”

Coeur d’Alene Mayor Jim Hammond shrugged the label off as “ridiculous,” pointing to his record as a state senator, and Post Falls mayor and councilman before that.

“I’ve practiced conservative fiscal actions throughout my public life,” Hammond said.

# A CLN trustee's view from the inside

Serving as a Community Library Network trustee has been challenging during my first 10 months in the office. In May 2023, voters clearly chose Tom Hanley and myself, by a large majority, to do the work we told them we would do. The majority obviously desired to have us remove the obscene books from minors' sections of the libraries.

That job has proven to be very difficult. The courts and library industry are stacked against us. The 1973 Supreme Court ruling in Miller vs California resulted in the universally devastating Miller Test, which prevents the removal of a book from a public library that has cultural, scientific or artistic value "when taken as a whole," even if some or many of the pages are obscene. Staff and citizens form their own opinions, but ultimately, a judge must rule on each book for certainty. If a library removes a book that a judge later decides does not meet the Miller Test, the court will order that it be restored to the library, lest First Amendment rights be violated by the government (public library) removing material that had been available to the public.

The library industry, guided by the American Library Association, has translated the Miller Test to their criteria of never removing a book based on its content. They forbid judging a book by its content as a measure to ensure never failing the Miller Test. Most library staff in the nation now equate the public's request to remove a book based on its content with topic restriction (content-based discrimination) as unlawful. Repeated public comments to the legislature by librarians reassert this.

The new Idaho library law, HB710, relies on the Miller Test and includes specific "harmful to minors" definitions. It

requires books to be moved out of minor areas or even removed from the library if the material is harmful to minors and adds fines to a library district that fails to comply.

How can CLN deal with this situation? The recent precedent-setting court case of public libraries in Llano County, Texas, gave a big hint: "Libraries have wide discretion with their selection and acquisition policies," but the withdrawal policies are governed by the Miller Test" and First Amendment. So, CLN is considering a separate selection and acquisition policy with tighter definitions to prevent the purchase of books voters don't want. The courts cannot force CLN to buy books or material the community does not want with our budget.

Moving books from one section to another is not something the courts have ruled on. CLN could use the newer (1982) Supreme Court "PICO" case: a book that is "pervasively vulgar," e.g., the stink

of a skunk in the crawl space pervades the whole house, or even if "the vulgarity is concentrated in a single poem, a single chapter or a single page, yet still be inappropriate" can be removed. This newer SCOTUS case could be the basis of moving books from one section to another and to avoid interventions with judicial decisions.

Accomplishing these changes is a challenge, with some staff, trustees and public attendees disagreeing with proposed policies. Some are afraid that CLN will remove their "essential" sex education books with detailed instruction. Many tend to redefine minors as 0-12 years because they need protection, but then, presumably, imply that those 13-17 should be able to access obscenity. Trustees who don't agree are called "evil" and "must be stopped." Spreading stories about us violating Open Meeting Law, falsely accusing us of colluding together at coffee shops or our suggesting that legal counsel provide private, written attorney-client advice in public meetings is used to shame the

conservative trustees.

How should the board handle CLN's government-run ICRMP insurance when ICRMP tries to dictate what the board can do with policies and reduces CLN liability coverage from \$3M to \$0.5M with no reduction in premium? The board majority asked for staff to solicit multiple competitive commercial bids, yet we are chastised when only a single bid was received.

Hiring an attorney who cooperates with the development of new policies is criticized as "irresponsible spending." The board's reduction in the budget was necessary to control rapidly increasing non-literary social programs that many incorrectly prioritized. Our oversight of the restoration of water-damaged facilities was crucial to maintaining the CLN budget.

Are these examples of "lawless actions," "destroying our libraries," or trustees working for the voters? Don't let the "Library Alliance of North Idaho" mislead you.

Dominated by Black Sheep sub-stores, the mall is eerily quiet with few shops maintaining consistent activity. Some argue that malls are simply dying, but a short drive to Spokane Valley or Northtown reveals thriving shopping centers bustling with activity even during their lulls.

Coeur d'Alene is similarly littered with the remnants of short-lived stores and repeated business failures, yet construction of new, doomed commercial spaces continues unabated. This cycle of growth and decay raises questions about the efficacy of our local leadership.

Furthermore, Coeur d'Alene's recreational offerings are limited. Beyond bars, hiking, hunting, and niche activities like mudding, options are scarce. for socialization?

While I recognize that Coeur d'Alene has flourished as a resort city, capitalizing on its natural beauty and lower cost of living, this singular focus seems increasingly detrimental. We must rethink Coeur d'Alene's paradoxical development strategies and expand its recreational offerings to truly thrive. Currently, despite a growing population, Coeur d'Alene feels like a stagnant, uninspiring dystopia for a decent portion of today's youth and young adults.

## **LIBRARIES:** Watch authoritarians in action

For decades library trustee roles were nonpartisan. Yet over this last year, the Community Library Network majority trustees have shown themselves to be extremist. That the end justifies the means is evident in how the majority treats fellow trustees, library staff, the press and the public.

Opinion pieces by Rachelle Ottosen, Tom Hanley and Tim Plass regularly use words like trash, filth, nasty and lying to describe ideas they don't like. Chair Ottosen uses Soviet terms to describe this newspaper, has sheriff's deputies remove citizens from public meetings, and labels library user input "propaganda."

Trustee Plass has argued with the district's lawyer about almost every point for months. He recently argued against governmental accounting rules with the outside accountant making the annual presentation of CLN's audited financial statements. These are tactics used by authoritarians.

In a new book about disinformation, author Barbara McQuade writes "under the rule of law, process is paramount... abusing the rule of law is one of the ways leaders disguise their efforts to undermine the will of the people."

# Actions, statements show contradictions about CLN

### Issue One: Culture War Allegations

These terms are the very language of culture wars, yet you deny having an agenda. This contradiction needs to be addressed.

You assert that you are not a Kootenai County Republican Central Committee candidate. However, you were one of their "rated and vetted," nonpartisan-endorsed candidates, indicating

## **PUBLIC COMMENT POLICY**

Board Draft: 05/06/2024

The Community Library Network Board of Trustees operates under the Idaho Code Open Meeting Law. The Board will be pleased to take comments under advisement, although they will not be responding at the meeting. Public comment **may** be addressed at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting. Comments may be submitted **in writing or orally or both**. The Board is committed to conducting its meetings in a civil, orderly, efficient, and productive manner. **The boards work and the publics experience of the meeting must not be disrupted by objects, behavior, noise, etc.**

When addressing the Board, please follow the guidelines below:

- Public comment at Board meetings is limited to the public comment portions of the meeting as indicated in the published agenda.
- Sign in before speaking, giving name and community.
- The speaker may address only library-related topics at regular and special meetings; only budget related topics at budget hearings. Comments should be addressed directly to the Board and not to the audience.
- A time limit of three (3) minutes is allowed for each speaker.
- A person may speak one time during the meeting.
- In cases of disagreement, the speaker must use grace and tact.
- Persons addressing the Board are expected to observe a level of civility and decorum appropriate for a public meeting.
- No personal attacks or disruptions from audience members will be tolerated.
- The Board Chair may terminate or redirect any presentation not adhering to these guidelines.

At the discretion of the Board Chair, these guidelines may be modified at a meeting.
